- Sets realistic expectations for all departments

## 2. An Early Tax-Credit Strategy

Cities and states don't just hand out rebates/film tax credits; to maximize incentives, a production must:

- Track correctly from day one
- Code expenses properly
- Keep every receipt
- Forecast payroll and fringes with accuracy
- Understand qualified expenses, how to qualify loan-outs, residency rules.  
Tax credits are essentially free money—if approached with discipline.

## 3. A Smart Crew Build-Out

The right team amplifies efficiency; the wrong team drags everything down. By choosing people aligned with the project's tone, pace, and culture, you prevent dozens of potential fires before they start.

#### **4. A Schedule That Reflects Reality**

A solid schedule honors the creative needs while respecting the physical, financial, and legal constraints. It's the foundation on which every day of the shoot is built.

As productions begin staffing for Q1, these fundamentals can make or break the process long before cameras roll.
